

NEW YORK CITY, May 2—Over 60 American and Chilean artists and supporters came together tonight at the downtown Otto Rene Castillo Center for Working Class Culture to express their support for 77 Chilean theatre artists threatened by Trizano, the notorious right wing death squad.

Among those performing during the evening of song, dance, mime and drama were Carol King, the world famous singer/songwriter, New York rock in rollers Paul Hipp and Mark Bosh, Pam Lewis, New York State coordinator of the New Alliance Party, and dancers Carmen Beuchat, Luanne Dietrich, Kae Kotarsky, Dafna Rosenblum and Cattly Baehner. Actress Norma Lomboy performed "La Mujer Americana," and mime Francesco Copello, depicted at left, did his "Masks." "El Puebo lo Unido" was performed by Don Hulbert of the Castillo staff on flute and David Belmont, ballot access coordinator for Lenora B. Fulani's Committee for Fair Elections, on guitar.

A phone call from director Luis Poirot and actress Carla Christe, both on the death list, was received from Santiago, Chile and a telegram from SIDARTE, the Chilean actors union, thanked the American artists for their support and invited them to a theatre festival to be held in defiance of the fascist government this July. Independent Presidential candidate Lenora Fulani sent a statement of support.

Hosting the event was actress Akuyoe Graham, the chief organizer of the event, and Dan Friedman, artistic director of the Castillo Theatre.
